AFRICA ENDEAVOR (AE)2018

AE is USAFRICOM's Senior Communications Leader Symposium and Pan-African Capstone event in a series of engagements with African Partners. It's primary purpose is to increase African Nation capability to contribute to regional military activities aimed at preserving peace and combatting transnational threats, supporting development of National Cyber Strategy, improving MIL-MIL relationships among African nations, and developing

ic Communities, the United Nations, and the George C. Marshall European Center for Security Studies enriched this year's program.

National cybersecurity strategy and communications interoperability in the field were the cornerstones for the 5-day program. For the first time, USAFRICOM Component Signalers facilitated functional working groups in Land Forces communications interoperability, Maritime com-

the TTX, adding audience participation to an already rich Marshall Center cyber program.

AE18 also increased its woman participants by 40% over last year's attendance. This is especially important in support of the National Action Plan on Women, Peace and Security.

A positive outcome of past AE events is a n increased percentage (30%) of female participation at MIL-MIL engagements.

AE18 was co-hosted by the Cabo Verde Ministry of Defense. Participants and facilitators from 32 African nations, 6 European nations, African Regional Econommunications interoperability, and Cybersecurity.

This year's AE also hosted its first Cybersecurity Table Top Exercise (TTX). A team of Czech Republic subject matter experts designed and facilitated



Cyber Security

Improving Cyber Security and greater African partner nation interoperability by educational seminars, collective assessments, new and existing training events and existing exchange programs and exercises. The cyber team supported Africa Endeavor symposium July 30-August 3, 2018 through presentations from senior cyber leaders and a cyber tabletop exercise lead by the Czech Republic's National Cyber and Information Security Agency.

USAFRICOM will accompany 10 African Partners attending the George C. Marshall Center for the Program on Cyber Security Studies (PCSS) resident course. The course is scheduled December 4-20, 2018. Participants in the program can expect to develop an understanding of the main cyber security issues, influencing transnational, regional and international security, factors shaping national cyber strategies, and the imperatives of cooperative security in an interdependent world.

USAFRICOM J6 has worked with the UN as a way of maximizing support to peacekeeping operations (PKOs) given the UNs key role in many of the PKOs throughout the continent. USAFRICOM J6 participated in the Training and Capacity Building Working Group at the 4th International Partnership for Technology in Peacekeeping Symposium, held by the 14-18 May 2018 in Berlin. Areas identified for possible cooperation included providing trainers for specific courses at the UN Signal Academy

(UNSA) in Entebbe, Uganda, providing Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) for revision of the UN Signals Unit Manual and handbook, assisting with development of Military Occupational Specialties (MOS) standards, Mission Operations Center mock up in Entebbe and Mobile training labs.

USAFRICOM J6 also attended the AMISOM-UNSOS Somalia Mission Force Multiplier and Technology Workshop 4-5 September in Mogadishu.

Follow on discussions from that have focused on comparison of the UN Peacekeeping Missions Military Signals Unit Manual and the Africa C4 Handbook developed in AFRICA EN-DEAVOR. USAFRICOM J6 will visit the UNSA on 16 October to discuss plans for the remainder of 2018 and discuss goals for 2019.

African Union (AU)



USAFRICOM J6's primary interaction with the African Union's Peace Support Operations Division (PSOD) has been through provision of an HF radio network in support of the African Union's African Standby Force Command, Control, Communica-

tions and Information System (AUC3IS).

The HF network provides secure voice and low speed data connections between AU PSOD in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, ECO-WAS in Abuja, Nigeria and ECCAS in Libreville, Gabon.

An expansion node at the AU Continental Logistics Base in Douala Cameroon is in process and expected to be complete in October 2018.

The African Union - United States Commission Technical Working Group (AU-US TWG) Meeting On Peace and Security will take place 18-19 October in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

AU Communications Work Group meeting will occur the day prior and will lay out objectives for the upcoming year.

Military to Military Engagements

The purpose of Military-to-Military (Mil-Mil) engagements is to build partner capacity by familiarizing and exposing African partner nations with signal and cyber defense key processes and training procedures, to include standardization, equipment, communications, and logistical support. The participants are exposed to multiple examples of communications procedures to include; development and structure of the U.S. Armed Forces signal corps, basic C4 and cyberspace operations, as well as standardization of these efforts through the use of USAFRICOM's C4 systems. USAFRICOM funds these engagements 100%.

USAFRICOM works closely within with our partner nations to promote peace, security, and open information sharing through Military-to-Military engagements. J6 is conducting three (3) Mil-Mil engagements.

1. **Junior Mil-Mil** - African communicators officers at the commissioned or senior noncommissioned officer level.

The next Junior Mil-Mil meeting will be held in San Antonio, TX on February 25-1April, 2019. 2. Senior Mil-Mil - African communicators officers at the commissioned officer level.
