Following graduation in 1986 from the University of Virginia with a Bachelor of Science degree in Commerce, COL Williamson was commissioned in the Corps of Engineers. His military education includes: the Engineer Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, Airborne and Air Assault Schools, Combined Arms Services Staff School, Command and General Staff College, Defense Strategy Course, and the Army War College. He holds a Masters of Arts in Procurement and Acquisition Management from Webster University and a Masters Certificate in Advance International Affairs from the Bush School of Government & Public Service at Texas A&M University.

Colonel Williamson's assignments include a range of command and staff positions at every level from platoon to Major Command. His overseas experience and deployments include tours in the Federal Republic of Germany, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Kosovo, Egypt, Afghanistan and Iraq in support of forward presence missions, Operations Desert Shield/Storm, Operation Noble Anvil, Multinational Force and Observers, and Operations Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom & New Dawn. He has also participated in a series of exercises and partnership exchanges with the United Kingdom, Germany, Republic of Japan and Republic of Korea.

His more recent assignments include Executive Officer of the 62nd Engineer Battalion (Combat) (Heavy) at Fort Hood, TX, where he trained, prepared, and deployed portions of the battalion in support of Operations Noble Eagle, Enduring Freedom, and Iraqi Freedom. Subsequently, COL Williamson became the Chief of Battle Command Training and Integration Division, a Combined Arms Center organization, in which he shaped the Army's digital battle command capability for the current and future force. COL Williamson then completed a three-year tour as Commander of the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion (Engineer), 395<sup>th</sup> Regiment (Training Support). His unit was prominent in mobilizing and training Reserve Component units for full spectrum operations in support of the Global War on Terror, Kosovo Force and MFO missions.

COL Williamson next served in Afghanistan as the Executive Officer for 36<sup>th</sup> Engineer Brigade as the unit performed construction, mobility and counter-IED operations supporting Operation Enduring Freedom. After graduating from the U.S. Army War College in 2009, he was assigned as the III Corps Engineer and deployed to Iraq to serve as the U.S. Forces-Iraq Deputy Director J7 in support of Operations Iraqi Freedom and New Dawn. His duties consisted of directing theater joint engineer operations, assuring mobility of USF-I forces, developing Iraqi military and civilian engineer capacity, and overseeing the closure and transition of U.S. bases to the Iraqi Government and other U.S. Government and partner organizations. Upon redeployment from Iraq, COL Williamson developed the engineer and river crossing plan in support of III Corps' participation in Ulchi Focus Guardian 11. He currently serves as the Engineer for U.S. Southern Command, responsible for U.S. forces military construction, energy and environmental programs, and partner nation engineer engagement to achieve U.S. interagency objectives in the area of operations.
