A difficult decision in which one or more of the ethical principles comes into conflict – competing values

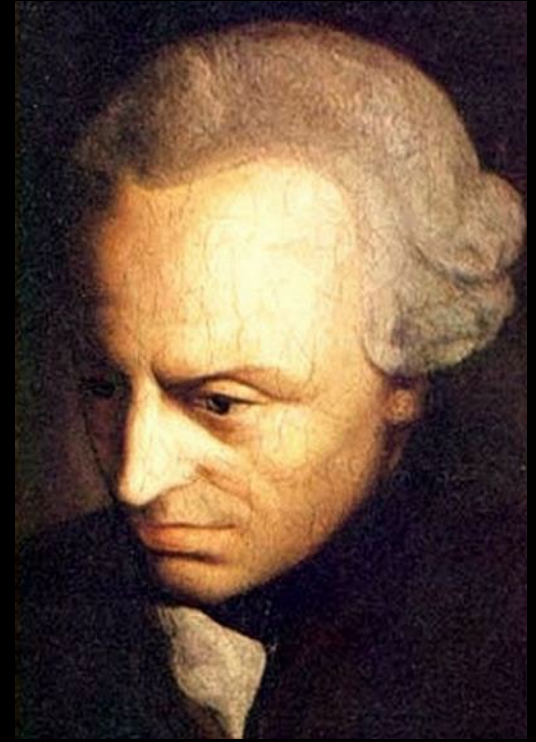
- Ethics of Duty

Deontology (Duty)

- The premise that a moral theory must be grounded in an account of what is unconditionally good – Kant
- Categorical Imperative – Always act in such a way that the maxim behind your actions can be willed as a universal law





Utilitarianism (Consequences)

- The view that a morally correct action is one that produces the greatest good
- This is based upon the consequences of the action

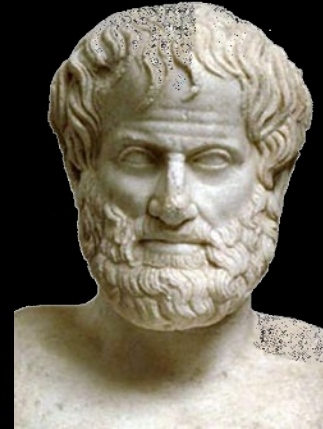

Cowardice (too little confidence)	Courage	Rashness (too much confidence)
Foolhardiness (too little fear)	Courage	Cowardice (too much fear)
Insensibility (too little pleasure)	Temperance	Self-indulgence (too much pleasure)
Meanness or Stinginess (too little giving)	Liberality	Prodigality or Wastefulness (too much giving)
Stinginess (in giving out large sums of money)	Magnificence	Tastelessness and Vulgarity (giving out large sums)
Undue Humility (too little honor)	Proper Pride	Empty Vanity (too much honor)
Inirascibility (too little anger)	Good Temper	Irascible (too much anger)
Shamelessness (too little shame)	Modesty	Bashfulness (too much shame)
Surliness	Friendliness	Flattery

Step 5:

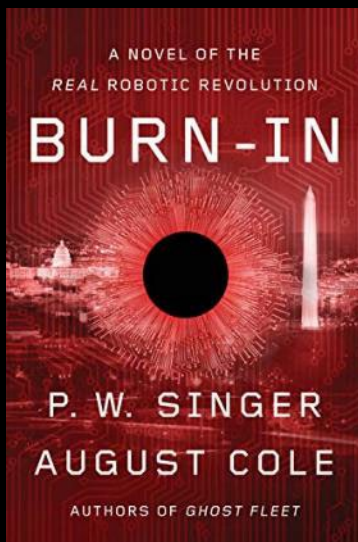
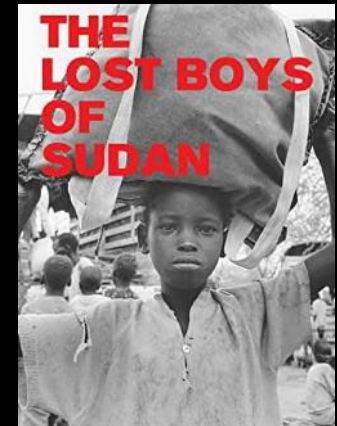
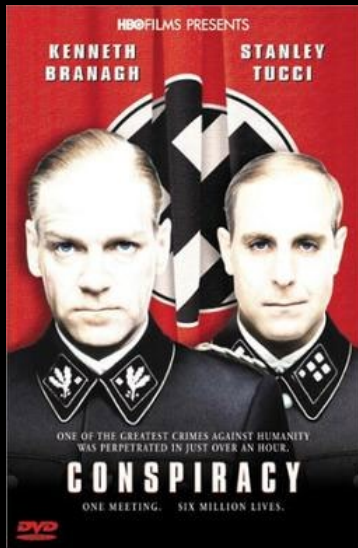
