Military Child Care

A DoD program that makes it easier to find child and youth care. Follow 4 steps to find information on child care programs worldwide, conduct a customized search for the care you need and submit a request for care at any location. MCC captures the military child care services that CYPs provide to children birth to 12 years of age through the following program types:

Child Development Center (CDC): A CDC is a facility-based program that provides child care services for infants through preschool age children.

Family Child Care (FCC): FCC providers are certified child care professionals who provide child care for infants through school age children in their homes, located either on or off of an installation. FCC providers typically offer a flexible schedule to support parents with a variety of care needs.

School Age Care (SAC): A SAC program is a facility-based program that provides child care services to children in full day kindergarten through grade 7.

Early Childhood Intervention Services (ECI) encourages families not to take a “wait and see” approach to a child’s development. A referral to ECI can be based on professional judgment or a family’s concern. A medical diagnosis or a confirmed developmental delay is not needed to refer. As soon as a delay is suspected, children may be referred by parents or professionals to ECI, even as early as birth.

The following services are provided at no cost:

- Evaluation and assessment
- Case management
- IFSP development
- Translation and interpreter services, including sign language

These initial services help identify your child’s strengths and needs, as well as locate resources to meet those needs. You may be asked for permission to bill your or your child’s insurance for these services.
