## EFMP Services


EFMP is more than just one program or connection point, it's the work of three components: Family Support, Identification and Enrollment, and Assignment Coordination. Enrollment in the EFMP is mandatory for active duty military members when a family member is identified with special medical or educational needs; identifying what services are available at current or new duty stations; and supporting families with information, referrals and non-clinical case management to access services.



## EFMP Family Support

EFMP Family Support plays a critical role in helping families navigate the Identification and Enrollment and Assignment Coordination processes. They also connect families with resources that helps them navigate federal, state, and local community organizations.

- Non-Clinical Case Management
- Education & Outreach
- Respite Care recertification and application process
- Assess needs and develop service plans to meet family goals and objectives
- M&FRC Services: Financial, Employment, Parenting, Deployment, Relocation, Transition Services, and Casualty

## EFMP Identification & Enrollment



### Special Medical Needs

You will be enrolled in EFMP if you have a spouse, child, or primary dependent of any age:

- Who requires special medical services for a chronic condition
- Who receives ongoing services from a medical specialist or specialty care clinic
- Who has significant behavioral health concerns (managed by primary care or requiring specialty care)
- Education

Medical services work with PCMs, Pediatrics, School Liaison and families to coordinate identification and enrollment in EFMP.

### Special Needs Coordinator (SNCs)

Local point of contact who can help with:

- Step-by-step support for EFMP enrollment
- Customized help with EFMP PCS preparation
- Support with Family Member Travel Screening OCONUS/CONUS clearance
- Linking families to medical care at new duty station

## Special Education Needs

### School Liaison Program

- Offer trainings to promote self-advocacy, IFSP/IEP knowledge, and transition timelines
- Inform parents of national, state and local education rights
- Assist in navigating school processes including private and home schooling

### Legal Office

- Provide IEP/504 eligibility support
- Provide advice and consultation on IEP/504 and dispute resolutions
- Assist in navigating special education federal and state education laws



## EFMP Assignment Coordination



Medical and military personnel departments work with military members and families to coordinate assignments. The assignment navigators prioritize the Air Force mission requirements with each family's special medical and/or educational needs prior to reassignment. The family's enrollment in the EFMP ensures that a family member's special medical and/or educational needs are considered and available at their new duty location.
