Purpose

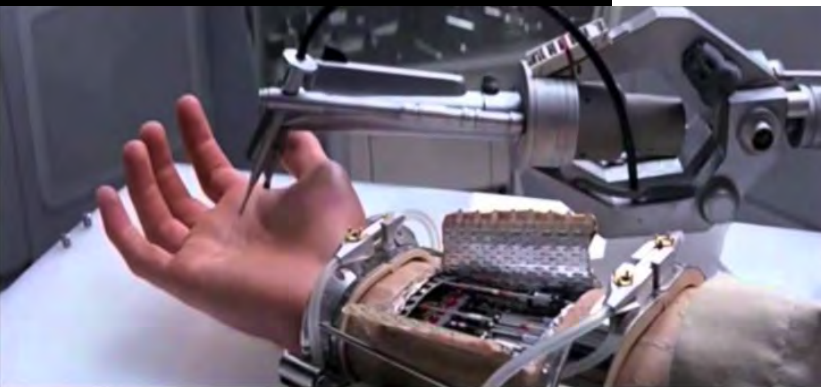
- The purpose of this presentation is to explore the future of healthcare by using various Future Hunter concepts:

While we cannot predict the future, looking at the past can provide clues as the trajectory of the present.

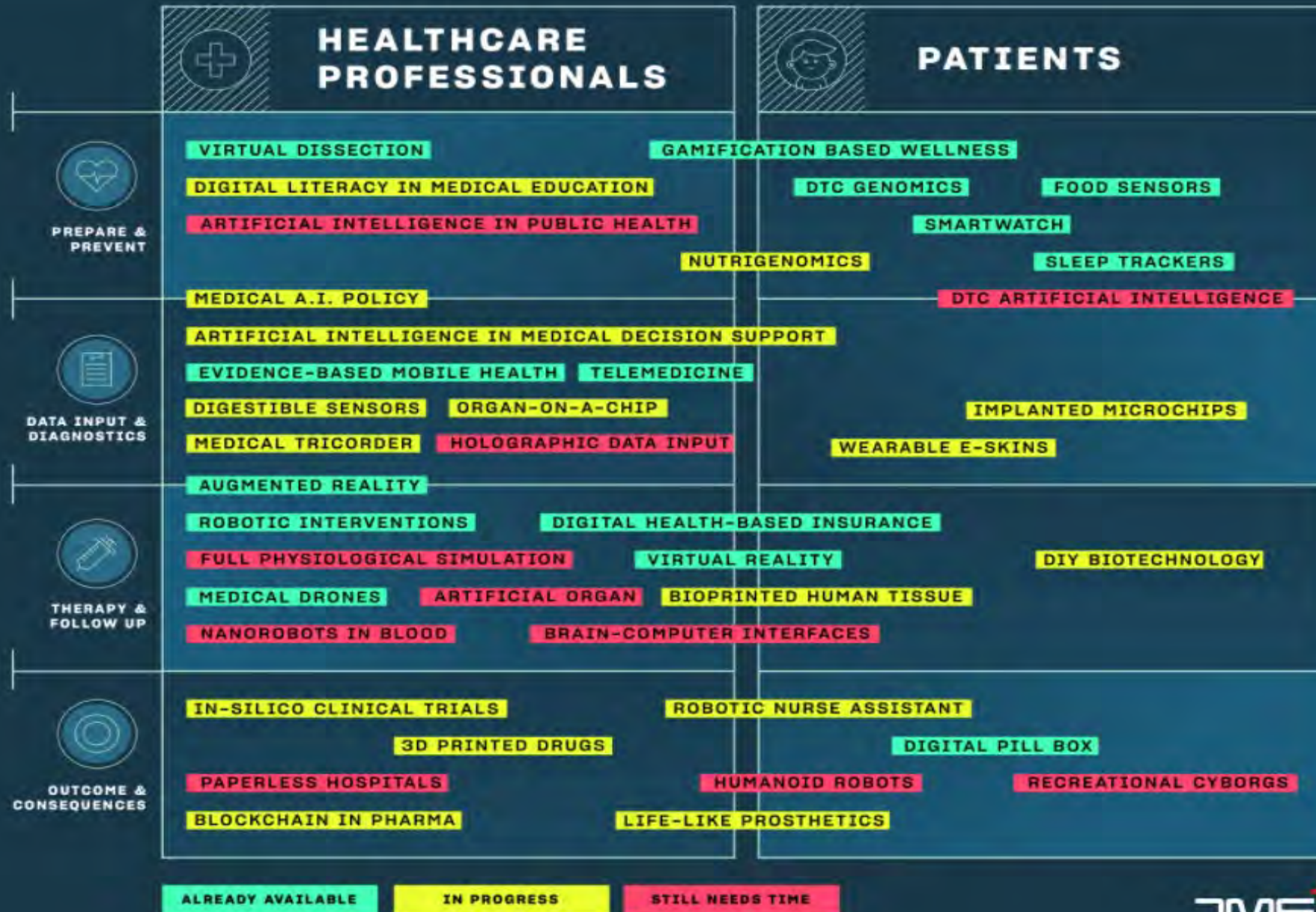
