

NATIONAL DEFENSE STRATEGY (NDS) & DEFENSE PLANNING AND PROGRAMMING GUIDANCE (DPPG)

The NDS provides strategic guidance on campaign and contingency planning, force development, and intelligence. It addresses how the Armed Forces will fight and win the Nation's Wars and work with partner nations to enhance security and avert conflict. The DPPG provides planning and programming guidance by establishing the Department's priority missions, force sizing construct, force planning assumptions, and key capabilities to size and shape the Joint Force.



DEFENSE PLANNING SCENARIOS (DPS)

DPS are classified resources that allow Components to assess capabilities and determine gaps for projected possible conflicts to aid in force design and ensure joint forces are using the same force modernization assumptions.

The DATE World provides the U.S. Army training community with a detailed, unclassified description of four regions of the world offering discussions of OE conditions through the PMESII-PT variables.
